Tapestry - our new online Learning Journey for Reception children

Announcement of Adoption Service Review

North Tyneside Fostering & Adoption Service have commissioned Adoption UK, the leading charity providing support, awareness and understanding for those parenting or supporting children who cannot live with their birth parents, to find out the needs of both people who have adopted through North Tyneside and adopters from other agencies who currently live in North Tyneside in January and February 2016.

Adoption UK will be conducting an online survey, holding 2 focus groups (1 weekend, 1 evening) and interviewing up to 10 local adopters and will produce a report and make

Illness

Before Christmas we were badly hit by a sickness bug, which swept through school. If your child has an illness such as a sickness bug, there is a recommended length of time that they must remain away from school. If your child is sick for example, they must be kept away from school for a full 48 hours. These recommended times are given to school by the School Public Health Nurse Team, and they are put in place in order to help stop a sickness bug spreading just as it did before Christmas. Please check with Mrs Boyd in the school office if you are unsure how long to keep your child off school, we have a chart to refer to, and please always keep your child off school if they are unwell. Thank you for your support with this matter.

This half term, we will be having Spring Term parents evenings on Monday 8^{th} and Wednesday 10^{th} February. A further letter with the appointment booking slip will be sent out nearer the end of January.

SATs Meetings - advanced notice
