### **School budget**

No doubt you will have heard about or read in the media about how school budgets are to be funded in the future, due to changes in the funding formula made by the government. Our budget for 2017-18 has already been affected even ahead of the new funding formula that will be introduced next year. Although this does not mean having to make any cuts to permanent staffing at school, there are some changes that you may however start to notice over the year. In the past, in order to keep the cost of school trips to a minimum for the affordability of parents, the school budget may often have covered the cost of the bus, or indeed subsidised a visit; these are

the types of changes you may start to notice, as we will no longer be able to continue subsidising activities such as this, so you may notice a small rise in cost to school trips. Obviously we will do our best to minimise any impact on the curriculum or range of activities that we offer our children, and the full impact of the future funding of schools is unclear as yet.

### **Breakfast club**

We are extremely grateful to all of the DBS cleared parents and grandparents who have covered breakfast club over the last three weeks. Seriously, we could not have continued to offer breakfast club without the offers of help that we received. With Mrs Conaty and Mrs Hogarth both being off at the same time, and for over 8 weeks, it was incredibly difficult to cover internally with staff. A huge thank you to: Donna Gibson, Lisa Short, Lisa Bell, Jim Nicholson and Karen Grieve, as well as our teaching assistants who had previously covered in the mornings. We are so grateful for all of your support.

A reminder also, that following the Easter break, the cost of breakfast session per day will go up to £3.
